



## **STATEMENT**



Koux is a 24-year-old Swiss-Danish multimedia artist with Ukrainian origins, who engages with Corporality and Nature as a starting point to explore the body, the skin, psyche, pain, and the organic. The spine is a recurrent element in her works, as a paradoxical symbol of strength and vulnerability, inspired by her fascination for organic shapes, but also the *Mavka*, a Ukrainian mythological figure that wanders with her back open. Influenced by her degree in psychology, she seeks to create an interactive, intimate and reflective space for her audience. Nathalia explores every possible medium, material and technique such as installation, sculpture, performance, sound/video art, painting and printmaking. She primarily integrates repurposed, discarded items, and organic components into her works, giving these elements new signification. Recently, she has been experimenting and researching innovative sustainable techniques with natural and nontoxic material for casting, as well as Scooby and Mycelium growth. This ethos extends to her incorporation of organic or partially-organic elements in her mediums, reflecting her profound connection to nature.




## Exhibition statement

## Psychosomatic Phenomenon

Corporeality, the state of existing as a physical body, is deeply influenced by a combination of biological inheritance and cultural socialization. This dual influence fosters the development of both psychological and physical selves, shaping them into embodied identities. "Psychosomatic Phenomenon" invites audiences to explore the intricate relationships between mind and body, revealing how deeply biological inheritance and cultural socialization influence corporeal perception and identity formation. From early childhood, individuals observe and unconsciously replicate adult behaviors and emotional coping strategies, profoundly shaping their understanding of and relationship to their minds, bodies, and somatic experiences. These early imitations serve as a blueprint for future responses to both physical and psychological distress. These formative experiences lay the groundwork for our responses to life's challenges, embedding learned behaviors and societal norms that shape our bodily functions, such as the relation to sexuality and pain management. The exhibition explores the profound meanings generated through the body's internal dialogue, which appears during the shift in consciousness throughout developmental stages.

This dialogue is characterized by a "functional deformation" in body image representation, as termed by E. Neizvestnyi, highlighting changes in how body parts are perceived and valued. Moreover, psychosomatic distress can emerge from dysfunctional corporeal socialization and emotional deprivation, potentially leading to delayed or distorted body representations and psychological suffering. The exhibition underscores the critical role of shared emotional experiences, such as joy, surprise, and anxiety, in fostering normal psychosomatic development. "Psychosomatic Phenomenon" features artworks, interactive installations, and performances that traverse a landscape of corporeal and emotional experiences. It invites visitors to engage with and reflect upon their own corporeality and the social constructs that shape it, shedding light on the profound interconnectedness of our psychological and physiological perception. This exploration not only illuminates the complex dynamics of the mind-body connection but also encourages a deeper understanding of the cultural body—a construct influenced by norms, taboos, and training that ultimately forms an inner regulating system. Through this exhibition, the audience is encouraged to contemplate the continuous co-evolution of bodily functions and psychological events, which together weave the fabric of human experience.


























PEEL MY SKIN Film 12'20" 2023-2024
